

# Prepping for the Critical Analysis and Reasoning Skills Section of the MCAT

### Overview

- 53 Questions spread across 9 passages (5-7 Qs per passage)
  - Skills tested are comprehension (1), reasoning (2), and extrapolation/incorporation (3)
- 90 minutes to complete the section
  - o Goal should be 10 mins per passage/Q set (~4 minutes reading, ~6 minutes on Qs)
    - Pacing checks should be every 2-3 passages
  - o Master a way to keep track of passage information (e.g. highlighting, note-taking)
- Passages take subject matter from diverse topics (23 AAMC topics is NOT exhaustive)
  - o Humanities (Art, Ethics, Literature, Philosophy, Pop Culture and more)
  - o Social Sciences (Anthropology, Economics, History, Psychology, and more)

## **Required Coursework**

- No required knowledge but abstract reasoning and critical thinking is a must-have
  - Courses which emphasize abstract thinking (philosophy), logical reasoning (law, debate), literature analysis (upper-level humanities)
- Creative writing courses and thesis development can also help master CARS reasoning
- Courses with labs components or Research Skills courses can help with extrapolation and incorporation questions

**Practice AND Review is the only way to improve** – Practice without thorough review and explanations will not yield better scores.
